#### **Current scenario in the EU**

Over **2.7 million new cases are diagnosed every year** in the EU. In fact, cancer is the second leading cause of mortality in the EU after cardiovascular diseases.



### **Projection**

It is expected that, without a strong action, the number of diagnosed cancer cases will increase by a fourth by 2035.

Improve telemedicine knowledge and preparedness of the cancer care workforce.


