## Current scenario in the EU

Over **2.7 million new cases are diagnosed every year** in the EU. In fact, cancer is the second leading cause of mortality in the EU after cardiovascular diseases.

## Projection

It is expected that, without a strong action, the number of **diagnosed cancer cases will increase by a fourth** by 2035.
